

36 HOLE STABLEFORD EVENT OVER 2 DAYS 9th & 30th March 2013

HISTORY

The Vicars Shield is in memory of Sir William Vicars, President 1907-1910. The Shield was donated and the trophy endowed in 1951 by Sir William's Daughter, Mrs. R I Furber. Originally, a one-day 36 holes stableford event, it is now held over two 18 hole rounds. The first winner of the Vicars Shield was Mr. D R Hill-Douglas.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION.

- 1. The competition is open to Eligible Members (ie, Male; Full Playing, Honorary Life, Former Life, Six Day Playing, Visiting, City, Intermediate, Junior Playing, Sub Junior Playing and Corporate Members) of Bowral Golf Club and will be played in accordance with the Rules of Golf and the Local Rules of Bowral Golf Club.
- 2. The standard Club ball competition will be run in conjunction with each round of this event.
- 3. The standard entry fee will be charged for each round.
- 4. Players will play off Club Handicaps (Max 36) applicable for the first round and which will remain unchanged for the second round.
- 5. In the case of a tie, the winner will be determined by count back.
- 6. The winner will have his name engraved on the Vicars Shield and announced at the Club's Annual Presentation of Trophies Dinner. The winner and runner-up will each receive a voucher for entry and complimentary food for one at the Club's Annual "Presentation of Trophies" Dinner. The current holder is David Boyd.
